

WATER TRACK WALK

Start the walk on the Old Railway line near Strathblane library and follow it to Blanefield Station. (Only the station house remains.) Turn left here and continue up the Cuilt Brae road (B821) to the first sharp bend. Take the private road going off right past Ardoch.

Follow this road until you come to a fork, bear left at this point just before a gate. (The road to the right goes to East Arlehaven and is not open to the Public.)

Go through the gate, closing it behind you, and follow the track until you join the West Highland Way at Arlehaven. Turn right and follow the West Highland Way round the back of Dumgoyach (a tree covered hill) and Dumgoyach farm, then on to the old railway line.

Follow the signs for the West Highland Way until you reach a stile and a notice board for Glengoyne Distillery. Cross the stile and follow the grassy track which brings you to a road flanked on either side by distillery ware-

houses and so to the main road A81.

Turn left along the A81 for a short distance until you reach a rough road going uphill on your right. Follow this, passing several cottages. the road bears round to the right leading to a gate which will take you on to the Water Track back to Blanefield.

Please keep dogs on the lead and close all gates.

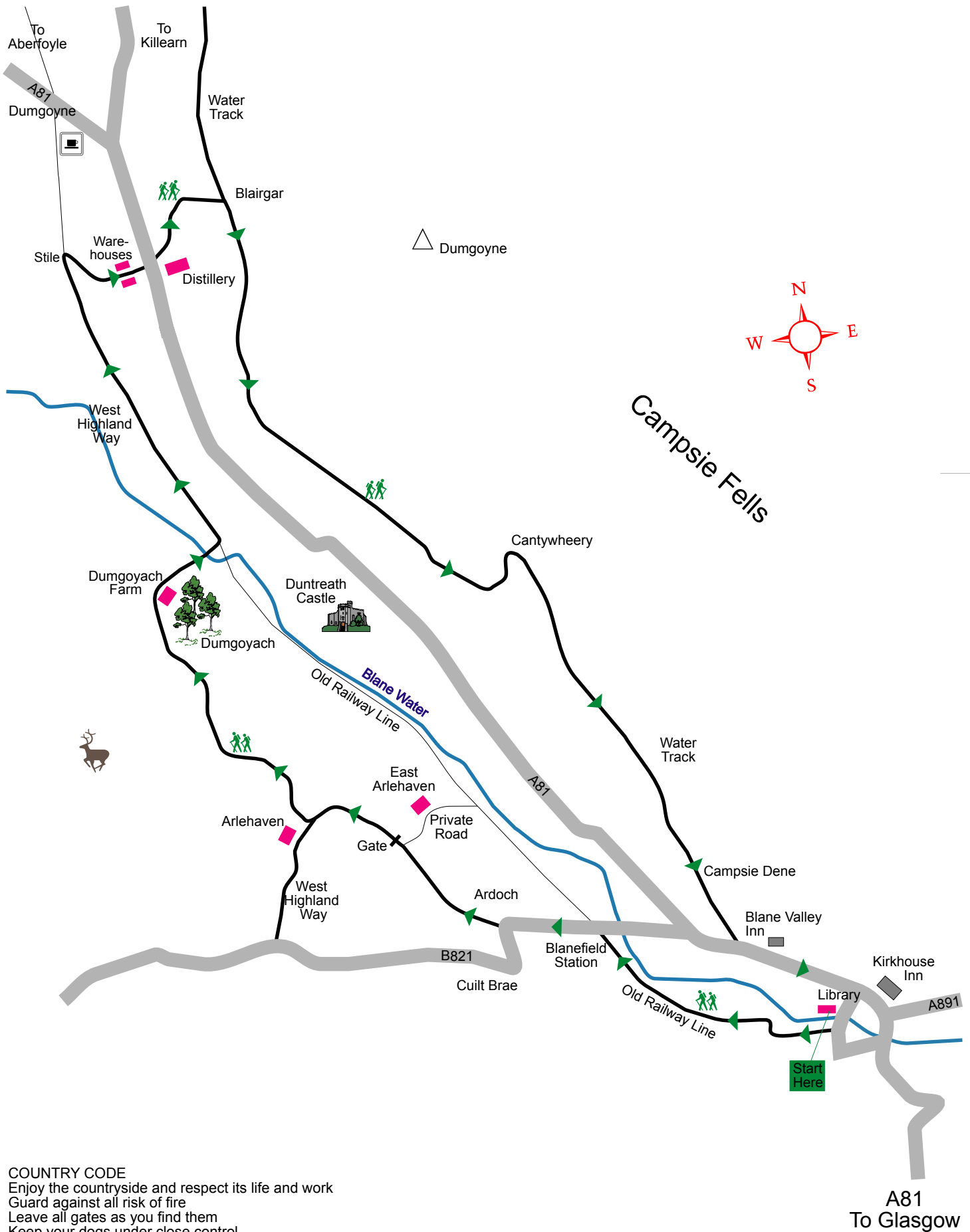
Distance - 8 miles approximately
